
Dear Praying Friends,

It has been a whirlwind around here (literally)! In September, Super typhoon Meranti drove past us, just off our Kaohsiung coast! Its gusts shook our building so forcefully, that it mimicked the shaking we usually feel during small earthquakes! Then came another strong typhoon, Megi, which was also filled with strong winds and lots of rain. Thank you to all who prayed for our safety. The Lord graciously protected us.

In other ways, it has remained a "whirlwind" in everyday life since our June prayer letter. Thank you for praying for summer camp (July) and for our childrens' VBS (August). Many church members helped with both ministries. During the week of camp, there was another typhoon, so we had to shorten camp by half a day to insure that everyone could get safely back to their homes. Grace Lee headed up our VBS again this year. Two ladies from a sister church helped with lesson time the first day. Then one of our Taiwan national missionaries, Emily Luo taught the remaining four days. Two children made salvation decisions. Since that week, we have had some of those children, along with their parents coming for Sunday school and morning worship service. Praise the Lord!

September 30 was International Bible Translation Day. In honor of that day, our congregation took up a special collection to support a Bible Translation project in India. (One of our supported missionaries is

assisting in that work.) We collected just short of \$2,000 usd. A few weeks later a large group from our church went on an outing to a Bible museum in a neighboring city; it displayed over 400 different language versions of the Bible, plus many special Bibles in Mandarin Chinese. There were huge Bibles, copied entirely by hand; there were Bibles. requiring miniature magnifying glass to read; and the personal Bibles of well-known Chinese leaders. We wish to encourage our people to appreciate the great blessing of having the Bible in their own language.



Two of our deacons and Matt have been team-teaching our adult Sunday school class. They are working their way through Jim Berg's book, Created for His Glory, which has been translated into Chinese. So far, there have been great discussions with the brothers and sisters that are participating. Our third deacon is helping to team-teach the Saturday night youth meetings. He has also been burdened to start up a youth Sunday school class, which began October 16th. We praise the Lord for these faithful and willing men who encourage our people to love and serve Christ.

Josh and Rachel Stewart returned to Taiwan on October 29. Their visa application was successful and they now have resident missionary visas, which allow them to remain in Taiwan indefinitely. Praise the
