Our year 2019 has been a full and active one. Here is a brief synopsis.

We journeyed on numerous, ministry-related, international trips this year. Our travels took us to Hong Kong (Matt in January), Cambodia (together in February), to the US twice (Matt in March & together in August-September), a closed nation (Matt in April), another closed nation (together in July), and as we mentioned above, Japan (together in November). From a purely personal perspective, our 2-day visit at Angkor Wat in Cambodia was one of the highlights of these journeys. However, the

Elizabeth works in the medical laboratory of a major hospital in Columbia, South Carolina. She is gaining experience and looking toward a possible future ministry in medical missions. All of them are actively involved in their local churches.

Matt passed a major milestone in August when he graduated in absentia from Bob Jones University with a Master of Divinity degree. This completed 14 years of study performed both in residence and online. He was asked by several people if now he was going to go for a doctorate: The answer is "NO!"


